GAME #1: "Bible Scavenger Hunt: Teen Edition"

Quick Explanation:

Each round, players will look up a Bible verse to discover the item they need to find and then search for that item.

Supplies:

A Bible for each player or a device with a Bible app on it.

Game Play:

1. Parent will announce the assigned Bible verse.
2. On "Go!" players must look up the verse and then search for the assigned item.
3. The first player to be able to look up the verse and point out the correct item gets a point.

Rules:

1. Players must wait until "Go!" to look up the verse.
2. Players should not announce the item they think they are searching for, until they have found it and pointed it out.
3. Should a player discover the wrong item, they may go back to the verse to see if they can discover the correct item.
4. Items can be either inside or outside of the car.
5. The player that finds the correct item each round gets a point.

Winner:

Player that gets the most total points at the end of game wins.

- Matt. 6:23 (Barn, not bird)

- Matt. 25:27 (A Bank)
- Luke 2:7 (an "inn"/ "guest room"- Hotel, Motel)
- Ezekiel 48:30 (an Exit)

GAME #2: “Celebrity Dinner Guess”

Quick Explanation:

Each player thinks of a celebrity dinner guest, a location, and a food that the other players in the car must try to guess.

Supplies:

No supplies needed

Game Play:

1. Each player takes a turn being the “dinner host” while the other players ask “yes” or “no” questions.
2. Guessing players have 1 question per category per round (person, location, food)
3. The next players turn continues the game until all players have had a chance to be the “dinner host.”

Rules:

1. The first “dinner host” thinks of a celebrity dinner guest, a location, and a food that they would serve.
2. The other players then take turns asking one question about each category.
3. Other players may make a guess at any time, but only on their turn.
4. The “dinner host” may only answer “yes” or “no.”
5. The first player to guess correctly all 3 categories, gets a point.
6. Play continues for at least 1 full round, with everyone having been the “dinner host,” but may continue for as long as the ride lasts.

Winner:

The person who has the most points (correct guesses).

GAME #3: "Highway to Spell"

Quick Explanation:

An on the road spelling bee, where players not only have to know how to spell the word but find all the correct letters using roadside signs and things along the road.

Supplies:

No supplies needed

Game Play:

1. Parent will announce a word, spelling-bee-style similar to "The word is "Dog" ... the "Dog" barked at the cat... "Dog."
2. Players then must spot the letters in order along the road on signs, advertisements, location names, and even other vehicles.
3. Players should point to the letter when they spot it and announce the letter.
4. The round continues until a player has spotted all the letters in the correct spelling of the word.
5. Game continues with each round being similar.

Rules:

1. The first player to spot a letter claims that letter and its location, and another player may not use the same location. They must find the letter on another location.
2. The letters must be spotted in order of the correct spelling.
3. Letters may be spotted inside or outside the vehicle. Once a letter and location is claimed by a player in one round, it may not be used again in another round.
4. The player that gets the word spelled first correctly gets a point.

Winner:

The person who has the most points (correct spellings).

Sample List:

Simple Words: Dog, Cat, Fish, Cow, Pan, Ball...

Medium Words: Shirt, Chair, Coffee...

Hard Words: Basketball, Lawnmower, Vacation, Boredom...

Really Hard Words: Principal, Lavatory, Confusion, Weird, Handkerchief...

ETC...

GAME #4: “Speedy Selfie Spree of Silliness”

Quick Explanation:

A super-fast silly cellphone photo scavenger hunt.

Supplies:

Everyone needs a cellphone or device that takes photos, has a timer, and receives text messages.

Game Play:

1. Parent will pull up to location (truck stop, oasis, convenient mart...).
2. Parent gives “quick explanation” and “rules”.
3. Players go inside the door to stand and await their text.
4. Parent will text the scavenger hunt list and start the 15-minute (suggested time) countdown clock.
5. Players, once they have received their text, must find, do, and photograph their assignments from the list.
6. When 60 seconds are left, parents will text a 60 second warning to be back in the vehicle.
7. Players return to vehicle to tally up points and share photos.

Rules:

1. Players must be respectful of location and others.
2. Player may not run, but may move quickly.
3. Players only have the assigned amount of time to do as many of their assignments as they can and return to the vehicle before time is up.
4. For every 30 seconds over the time limit, player may lose 1 point.
5. Each item completed and photographed on the list counts for 1 point.

Winner:

The person who has the most points (correct guesses)

Sample List to Text: “A Selfie of You...”

- ...with a bottle of orange soda
- ...sitting on a chair
- ...with a dog
- ...holding someone’s hand
- ...giving the thumbs up to an employee
- ...doing a dance
- ...talking on a CB radio
- ...wearing sunglasses
- ... coughing by the coffee
- ... twisted up like a pretzel by a bag of pretzels
