

# PALM SUNDAY

## Read

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and at once you will find a donkey tied there, with her colt by her. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, say that the Lord needs them, and he will send them right away."

This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: "Say to Daughter Zion, 'See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.'"

The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them. They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Matthew 21:1-9 ESV

## Say

Just days before His death, Jesus began His journey to Jerusalem knowing He would soon endure the cross. In today's passage, Jesus commanded two of His disciples to go ahead, telling them to look for a colt and bring it to Him to use.

The Lord would use this colt for His humble entry into Jerusalem, to which the people responded with praise upon the sight of Him.

Consider all that Jesus must have been thinking as people praised Him on Palm Sunday, knowing just days later they would demand He be crucified.

## Do

Think back over your life and identify one of the greatest days you've ever experienced. It might be the day you received a special award, a vacation, the day you accepted Christ, etc.

Many people today would love to be celebrated by crowds and received as well as Jesus was on Palm Sunday. Some would even mark this type of day as a "highlight" on their timeline.

Re-read Mark 11:9-10

Why was the praise of the crowds significant? Their worship was an acknowledgement of God's promises fulfilled in Jesus!

## Pray

Dear Jesus, We are filled with joy that you came to be our forever king. You deserve all of the joy, excitement, praise, and worship we can offer to you. Amen.

# MONDAY

## Read

On reaching Jerusalem, Jesus entered the temple courts and began driving out those who were buying and selling there. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the benches of those selling doves, and would not allow anyone to carry merchandise through the temple courts. And as he taught them, he said, “Is it not written: ‘My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations’? But you have made it ‘a den of robbers.’”

Mark 11:15-16 ESV

## Say

Jesus was calm amid hungry crowds, angry storms, & those ready to stone the woman caught in adultery. But when Jesus walks into the temple and witnesses people not taking the worship of God seriously, He becomes irate and clears the temple courts and overturns tables.

## Do

“It feels like a Monday” – Imagine you’re at work or school on Monday morning and you have made your checklist for the week. Your schedule is busy, but it looks as if you’ll have a productive and successful week. Nothing should keep you from accomplishing your plans/goals. Suddenly, your boss or teacher comes in and asks to review your plans. He or she looks at you and states that you are working on the wrong projects and your priorities are wrong. You must decide what you need to give up or quit doing and refocus on more important work.

How would you feel/respond?



# PRAY

DEAR GOD, THANK YOU FOR CREATING US TO WORSHIP YOU AND GIVE YOU GLORY. HELP US TO SEE WHEN OUR TEMPLES (OUR THOUGHTS AND HEARTS) ARE MESSED UP BY OUR SIN AND TO ASK YOU FOR FORGIVENESS TO CLEAN OUT OUR SIN. WE WANT EVERYTHING WE DO, SAY, AND THINK TO WORSHIP YOU. AMEN.

# TUESDAY

## Read

One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, “Of all the commandments, which is the most important?”

“The most important one,” answered Jesus, “is this: ‘Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.’ The second is this: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no commandment greater than these.”




## Say

The religious leaders were looking for ways to catch Jesus saying something that didn't line up with God's rules. Instead, he gave answers that taught people how to best worship God. Loving God and loving others well shows others a true picture of God's love for them. How can we show God our love for him and show others God's love?



## DO

**CUT OUT TWO, LARGE PAPER HEARTS FROM CONSTRUCTION PAPER.**

**ON ONE HEART, WRITE “LOVE GOD”; ON THE OTHER, WRITE, “LOVE OTHERS”.**

**TAKE SOME TIME AS A FAMILY TO WRITE DOWN ON EACH CORRESPONDING HEART DIFFERENT WAYS YOU CAN LOVE GOD AND OTHERS WELL.**

**HANG THE HEARTS UP IN A PLACE YOU CAN SEE THEM.**

**PICK THINGS OFF YOUR HEARTS TO DO THIS WEEK.**

Dear Lord, We want to be obedient followers of you who love you with everything we have and to love others so they can see how much you love them. Help us to listen to your voice as you show us opportunities to do both this week. Amen

# WEDNESDAY

## Read

Now the Feast of Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called the Passover. And the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how to put him to death, for they feared the people.

Then Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was of the number of the twelve. He went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers how he might betray him to them.

And they were glad, and agreed to give him money. So he consented and sought an opportunity to betray him to them in the absence of a crowd.

Luke 22:1-6

## Say

Many refer to this day of Holy Week as Silent Wednesday because there's not much recorded on this day. Some believe this could have been the point during which Judas conspired with the chief priest to betray Jesus.

Although we don't know for sure what all took place on this day, we do know the devil was undoubtedly at work.

The enemy would use the religious leaders to lead the charge. Meanwhile, Jesus was likely spending time with those He loved despite knowing everything He was about to face.

## Do

Find a quiet spot in your house free from other noises or distractions. Set a timer for 3 minutes and sit in silence with nothing in your hands.

- Pause briefly to ask God to speak to your heart and mind. Then sit in stillness and listen.
- After the time has passed, jot down what you learned, observed, or sensed God sharing with you.
- Reflect: What was the hardest part of waiting for you? How does silence or the inability to control circumstances make it hard to wait?

## Pray

Dear God, Thank you for sending your son, Jesus, as the one who would rescue all who believe in him from sin and death. Amen.

# THURSDAY

## Read

Therefore many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary, and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him. But some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done. Then the chief priests and the Pharisees called a meeting of the Sanhedrin. "What are we accomplishing?" they asked. "Here is this man performing many signs. If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and then the Romans will come and take away both our temple and our nation."

Then one of them, named Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, spoke up, "You know nothing at all! You do not realize that it is better for you that one man die for the people than that the whole nation perish." He did not say this on his own, but as high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus would die for the Jewish nation, and not only for that nation but also for the scattered children of God, to bring them together and make them one. So from that day on they plotted to take his life.

John 11:45-53 NIV

## Say

While Jews were preparing the Passover meal, Jesus was also preparing the Disciples for what would be the last supper He had with them. Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him. Jesus knew that Peter would deny Him. Jesus knew that the Disciples would desert Him.

Even still, Jesus obeyed the will of His Father.

Verse one of today's reading says, "having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end" (John 13:1).

Consider the depths of God's unconditional love for you. Take a moment to thank Him for His unwavering love.

## Do

Using a paper plate, decorate one side with bright colors and the words, "We believe." to represent all of the people who believed Jesus was who he said he was. Decorate the other side with dark colors and the words, "We do not believe." Talk about the difference between the two kinds of people and why some thought Jesus was a threat who needed to be arrested.

## Pray

Dear God, Thank you for loving us so much you are willing to do anything to cleanse us. Thank you for going to the cross so we could be clean of our sins that separate us from you. Amen.

# FRIDAY

## Read

And they crucified him. Dividing up his clothes, they cast lots to see what each would get. It was nine in the morning when they crucified him. The written notice of the charge against him read: the king of the jews. They crucified two rebels with him, one on his right and one on his left.

Those who passed by hurled insults at him, shaking their heads and saying, "So! You who are going to destroy the temple and build it in three days, come down from the cross and save yourself!" In the same way the chief priests and the teachers of the law mocked him among themselves. "He saved others," they said, "but he can't save himself! Let this Messiah, this king of Israel, come down now from the cross, that we may see and believe." Those crucified with him also heaped insults on him.

At noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And at three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"). When some of those standing near heard this, they said, "Listen, he's calling Elijah." Someone ran, filled a sponge with wine vinegar, put it on a staff, and offered it to Jesus to drink. "Now leave him alone. Let's see if Elijah comes to take him down," he said. With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last.




# SAY

SOMETIMES IT'S HARD TO UNDERSTAND WHY JESUS HAD TO DIE. HE WAS THE ONLY ONE WHO COULD TAKE ON ALL THE SINS OF THE WORLD BECAUSE HE WAS SINLESS AND INNOCENT OF ANY WRONGDOING. HE WAS PUNISHED, HUMILIATED, BEATEN, AND MADE FUN OF. BUT NO MATTER WHAT, JESUS WAS OBEDIENT TO HIS FATHER BECAUSE IT WAS THE ONLY WAY FOR FORGIVENESS TO BE MADE COMPLETE.

# DO

USING PAINTERS TAPE, TAPE A CROSS SHAPE ONTO THE CENTER OF A WHITE PIECE OF PAPER. HAVE YOUR KIDS COLOR THE ENTIRE PAGE WITH A BLACK MARKER OR CRAYON. WHEN THEY'RE DONE, CAREFULLY PEEL OFF THE TAPE, REVEALING A WHITE CROSS. THE BLACK REPRESENTS SIN, AND THE WHITE OF THE CROSS IS JESUS WASHING PEOPLE'S SINS AWAY SO THEY CAN BE PART OF GOD'S FAMILY FOREVER.

**DEAR JESUS, THANK YOU

# SATURDAY

## Read

After these things Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away his body. Nicodemus also, who earlier had come to Jesus by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds in weight. So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, since the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there.

John 19:38-42 ESV

## Say

The Sabbath day was a very important day in the Jewish culture. You didn't cook or work on that day, so the day before was spent in preparation. Those who loved Jesus were able to wrap his body in cloth and put him in a tomb but didn't have time to do everything the people usually did to get a body ready for burial. After the most awful day when Jesus died, can you imagine how hard it was for his followers to be quiet and rest? But that's what they did.

Probably with lots of tears and sadness. What would it have been like for those who loved him to try to rest even though they were probably hoping beyond hope to find out his death was just a bad dream?

## Do

The day between Jesus' death and his resurrection was probably an even quieter day than usual. We don't like waiting, especially when we don't know what's going to happen next. Set a timer for you to sit as a family in silence as a reminder that the followers of Jesus went from walking with him, learning from him, and being with him to silence from him.

## Pray

Dear God, Thank you that even when it seems you're silent, you're not. When Jesus died, it didn't seem like anything good was ever going to happen again. But you were working behind the scenes, preparing for a huge celebration. Help us to be patient and always trust you in the quiet, waiting times. Amen.

# SUNDAY


## Read

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise." And they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest.

Luke 24:1-9 ESV

## Say

What an amazing end to a story that was really an amazing beginning! Jesus died on the cross and was raised to life again which was a very happy ending for his followers who were so very sad. But, in a way, it was just the beginning. The beginning of a new way of living in relationship with God. No longer would people need to continually make sacrifices for their sins to be forgiven. They just had to believe Jesus was the Son of God who had died and rose again to beat sin and death forever. It's the happiest story ever and the most exciting day in history...until the day that Jesus returns to make all things new for those who believe!



# DO

BAKE EMPTY TOMB ROLLS TOGETHER (SEE RECIPE BELOW).

WHILE YOU MAKE THEM, TELL YOUR KIDS THAT THE MARSHMALLOW REPRESENTS JESUS.

AS YOU WRAP THE MARSHMALLOW IN THE DOUGH, EXPLAIN THAT THE DOUGH IS THE TOMB IN WHICH JESUS' BODY WAS SEALED.

BAKE THE ROLLS.

WHEN THE ROLLS ARE SLIGHTLY COOLED BUT STILL WARM, OPEN THEM UP TO FIND AN EMPTY SPACE INSIDE WHERE THE MARSHMALLOW WAS.

JESUS WAS RISEN; HE WAS NO LONGER IN THE TOMB!

## Empty Tomb Rolls Recipe

1 (10 ounce) package jumbo refrigerated crescent rolls  
1/4 cup sugar  
1 tablespoon ground cinnamon  
8 large marshmallows  
1/4 cup butter, melted

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Prepare muffin pan (preferably jumbo muffin pan) with non-stick cooking spray.
2. Separate rolls into eight triangles and set aside. Combine sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl.
3. Dip each marshmallow into butter, then roll in cinnamon-sugar and place on a triangle dough. Pinch dough around marshmallow, sealing all edges. Make sure to seal well or all the marshmallow will escape.
4. Dip tops of dough into the remaining butter and then into the cinnamon-sugar. Place rolls with the sugar side up into prepared muffin cups.
5. Bake at 375 degrees for 13 - 15 minutes. Eat warm.
